

SBC WG M&E Workstream

- **SBC WG M&E resources** were developed between 2014-2018
- **Many changes** in the malaria SBC landscape since then:
 - Growing interest in provider behavior change
 - New data sources for household behaviors
 - Shift from SBCC (communication focus) to SBC (broader focus)
- More can be done to stay abreast of these trends and encourage use of our resources

2023 Global Fund Replenishment

- 2023 Global Fund replenishment was **lower than needed**
 - Target: US\$18 Billion
 - Final Amount Raised: US\$15.7 Billion
 - Allocations have been impacted, 29 countries had their allocations reduced
- Including quality malaria SBC plans in Global Fund applications is more important than ever
- Remember: Commodities are only effective when people seek them and use them correctly and consistently

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
Malaria SBC in Global Fund Grant Applications

The Global Fund shared the following guidance during the proposal orientation meeting in Nairobi, Dec 2022:


1. Investments in SBC need to be **evidence-based**, **results oriented**, **theory informed** and **part of the national malaria SBC strategy**







More Global Fund Application Tips

1. We must be champions for SBC:

- a. Phrase it not as "nice to have" but as "must have"
- b. GFATM is not opposed to SBC, it just needs to be solidly justified
- 2. Participate actively in the Mock TRP Sessions
- 3. Ground everything in your National SBC Strategies and National Strategic Plans
 - a. Do not propose only "awareness raising" and World Malaria Day
- 4. Contrary to what many think, **budget cuts happen more during grant making and the CCM makes many of the decisions**
 - a. Lobby to the Country Coordinating Mechanism (CCM) in country
- 5. Look for **ANY opportunity to reduce costs and highlight those**

Project overview

Total Target Population:


- Total Population 1,900,000 (ZSA 2022)
- Project Target Approx. 11,100,000 Zambians (ZSA 2022)

Geographic Focus:

- 4 high malaria burden provinces: Eastern, Luapula, Muchinga & Northern
- 7 Pre-elimination districts in Eastern province
- Selected activities: Central and Copperbelt provinces (since 2023)

Period of Performance:

• 5 years (Oct 01, 2020 – Sept 29, 2025)



Introduction

- Interpersonal Communication (IPC) is tailored, face-to-face communication between health provider and client. This can also include health talks at health facilities, and engaging communities
- IPC is a proven approach to Social & Behavior Change (SBC)
- IPC can lead to increased uptake of key malaria products and services including IPTp, seeking early treatment, indoor spraying and treated mosquito nets

Background

- Zambia provides a range of malaria services, including intermittent presumptive treat (IPTp) for pregnant women
- Zambia's 2021 Malaria Indicator Survey (MIS) revealed a 65% uptake of three or more doses of IPTp in rural areas

 Information, education, and communication (IEC) can be effective in increasing malaria knowledge, but it does not translate into adoption of desired behaviors

Zambia's National Malaria
Elimination Strategic Plan (NMESP)
(2022-2026) identifies IPC as a
priority SBC approach

The IPC approach

- PMI's PAMO Plus project has shifted from a focus on IEC to a more holistic SBC approach
- The project is empowering deploying volunteer community change agents (CCAs) to use IPC during their interactions with community members



Methods

- In 2021, the NMEP introduced IPC through CCAs in the 4 PAMO Plus provinces
- PAMO Plus supported training of 6,113 CCAs deployed:
 - CCAs work within own communities
 - 1 CCA per 100 households
 - 1:500 population
- The CCAs conduct
 - Household visits
 - Health talks
 - Community dialogues
 - Peer education
 - Basic counselling



IPC Process

- CCAs engage individuals and communities to:
 - Identify behavioral barriers
 - Facilitate a two-way discussion to address the barriers
 - Demonstrate and encourage proper use of interventions


- CCAs conduct peer education & basic counseling. For example, to support:
 - Pregnant women and spouses to go for early enrollment for antenatal care to access malaria prevention medicines
 - Seeking early testing (and treatment if positive) for fever

Results

- Since the deployment of largely malaria-focused IPC, the NMEP has recorded improvement in the uptake of malaria products and services
- In Kanchibiya District Muchinga Province where IPC was first deployed:
 - 1st dose of IPTp within the first trimester of pregnancy increased from 54.2% in 2020 to 69.3% in 2022 (28% increase)
 - 3rd dose of IPTp increased from 26.9% in 2020 to 40.3% in 2022 (50% increase)
- For comparison, Shiwang'andu, a neighboring district where IPC was not deployed:
 - 1st dose of IPTp within the first trimester of pregnancy decreased from 77% in 2020 to 72.5% in 2022 (5.8% decrease)
 - 3rd dose of IPTp decreased from 65.1% in 2020 to 45.6% in 2022 (30% decrease)

- Several factors such as SP availability are attributable to the positive result
- IPC is one of the contributing factors that led to the increase in IPTp 1 & IPTp 3 indicator increase
- Further investigations need to be done to further ascertain the contribution of IPC in improving malaria indicators

Discussion & Conclusion

The deployment of IPC through CCAs in the four PMI/PAMO Plus supported provinces contributed to an increase in uptake of malaria services and products

IPC deployed to scale will contribute to behavior change and accelerate malaria reduction and elimination efforts in Zambia
